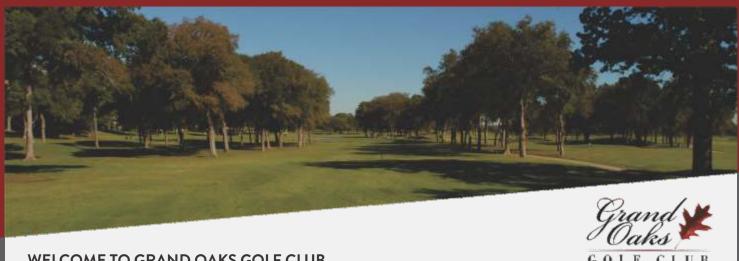

WELCOME TO GRAND OAKS GOLF CLUB

Grand Oaks was designed by renowned golf course architect and professional golfer Don January. Within the secluded and naturally beautiful tract of land, Mr. January accomplished his goal of sculpting a golf course that would challenge golfers of all skill levels and be enjoyable to play.

This tranquil setting features century-old oak trees, abundant wildlife and two meandering waterways, all contributing to a unique and memorable golf experience. To date, Grand Oaks Golf Club remains one of the best kept secrets in the metroplex.

The golf course was recently updated to restore the original demand for shot-making & creativity. The course now offers 5 sets of tees to choose from depending on your skill level. The back tees now measure over 7,000 yards with a par of 72.

Additionally, the greens have been expanded to include false fronts and run-offs, which keeps the golfers thinking throughout the hole.

The classic design of Grand Oaks Golf Club features treelined fairways, small greens and variety. This self-contained golf course makes you feel as though you are at a lush nature park. With homes tucked away only around the parameter of the property, our golfers enjoy the traditional look and feel of golf at its finest.

The golf course is professionally maintained and features tiff-dwarf burmuda greens and 328 burmuda fairways and roughs. We offer excellent golfing conditions throughout the year and provide the services only seen at the finest of golf clubs.

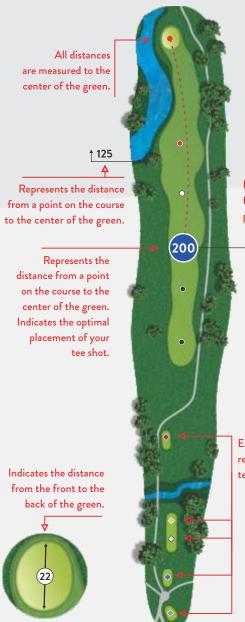














Represents the distance from each tee to this point on the course.

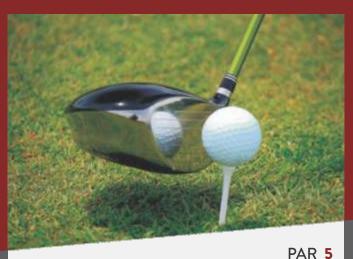
Each colored dot represents a different tee in the tee boxes.

HOLE ONE

HANDICAP 11/3

Start your day off with a birdie. Longer hitters can reach this medium length par 5 in two. Water on the left inside 100 yards and a small elevated green will test your nerves and your short game.







HOLE TWO

HANDICAP 1/7

Risk reward. The most difficult hole on the course narrows to around 30 yards between two ponds bracketing the fairway. Any driver hit off line is likely to swim with the turtles. The backstopped green makes it easier to hit long irons and save par on this long par 4.

HOLE THREE

HANDICAP **15 / 11**

Beware the slope. Being below the hole on this par 3 is a must. Downhill putts are likely to leave you with a chip back up from the base of the green. Shots pulled left of the bunker will find you scrambling from "Bogey Valley".

HOLE FOUR

HANDICAP 7/13

Cut the corner. This short par 4 is reasonable for any player. A long iron or 3 wood is all average hitters will need to find themselves with a good number from the fairway. Longer hitters can swing away and head for the green.







HOLE FIVE

HANDICAP 9/15

Left is death. The longest par 3 on the front requires distance and accuracy. Ending up in the green side bunker right is better than losing it left and finding yourself well below the green. Once on the putting surface, putts to the back of the green will break harder left than seems possible.









HOLE SIX

HANDICAP 5/1

Mind your manners. Clearing the creek and finding the narrow elevated fairway will go a long way to avoiding big numbers on this par 5. Shots pushed right off the tee may find the tree that guards the right side. Reachable in two if you can manage not to pull it into the creek that runs the entire length of the hole on the left.







HOLE SEVEN

HANDICAP 17 / 17

What you see is what you get. Find your number, pick your club, and stick it close. Don't miss this opportunity to shave a stroke off your scorecard.









HOLE EIGHT

HANDICAP 13/9

Down the chute. This short par 4 looks easy enough off the tee. Beware of the water that surrounds most of this small green. Iron off the tee will keep you from reaching the water. Front of the green is the play as the green runs away from you and can end up in the water behind the green.









HOLE NINE

HANDICAP 3/5

Grip it and rip it! This long par 5 is played with the wind most days here in Texas. Clearing Kirby Creek with a solid second shot will leave you a short wedge shot into this green guarded by two bunkers.









Over the bridge. Shots started down the right side of the fairway pay off on this forced carry par 4. The farther left you go, the farther the carry over the creek. Staying right of the pin on your approach shot will help you avoid the false edge on the left side of the green.







HOLE ELEVEN

HANDICAP 4/4

There's water down there. Many well-hit drives have found their way through the end of the fairway and into the creek never to be heard from again. Don't get greedy. Three well placed conservative shots will leave you with a chance for a birdie.









HANDICAP 8/8

Don't go long. Hitting the large green on this medium length par 3 shouldn't be too much of a problem. However, beware the back flag. Shots landed on the back of this green may well find themselves down the hill and on the wrong side of the path.

HOLE THIRTEEN

HANDICAP 10 / 10

Go for it! With only a little tree trouble on the left and a pond on the right, this wide fairway is open and inviting. Swing away.







HOLE FOURTEEN

HANDICAP 16 / 16

Deception. Playing this hole with swirling winds and an elevated green makes it more than meets the eye. Take care in your club selection on this hole or you may find yourself scratching your head and asking, "How did I get here"?

| Golfer Notes: | | | |
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Don't be a hero. Many things can happen if you take your driver out of the bag on this hole...most of them are bad. Hit a four iron at the 150 marker in the middle of the fairway. This will leave you no more than a short wedge onto this inviting putting surface.







HOLE SIXTEEN

HANDICAP **14 / 14**

Not for the faint of heart. Hitting driver on this hole is a low percentage shot. The section of the fairway on the right is only 10 yards wide as it passes a pond in the middle. A well placed mid iron shot will keep you out of trouble and in red numbers.



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HOLE SEVENTEEN

HANDICAP 18 / 18

Eagles nest. This par 5 is very reachable in two with the aid of a solid tee shot. One of the largest greens on the course slopes from back to front making uphill eagle and birdie putts very makable if your are aggressive.

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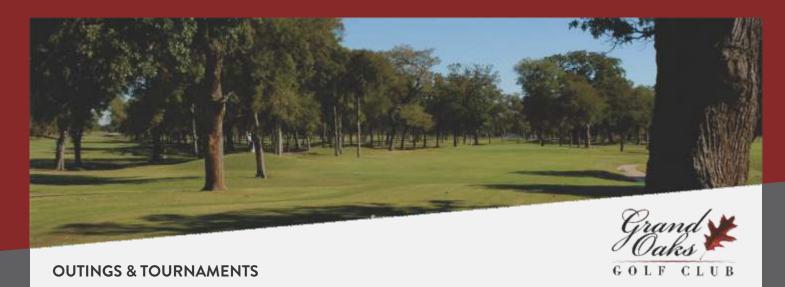
HOLE EIGHTEEN

HANDICAP 6/6

Finish strong. End your day on a high note with a birdie here at 18. More conservative players will want to take it up the left side and avoid the pond on the right side of the fairway. Players wanting to flex their muscles can go directly for the flag. Good luck.

Upon Arrival...

CLUB DISTANCE CHART

Use this Club Distance Chart to help gauge your progress and save strokes on the course. Knowing the exact distance you hit your clubs not only enhances your confidence but also replaces guessing with real numbers. This is especially helpful in determining club choice quickly and easily on the course. Knowing your distances is also useful when evaluating your club inventory. When considering adding or replacing a club in your set, knowing the actual distance you hit each club is crucial in choosing the club that will most benefit your game. Why carry two clubs that hit the same distance if you really only need to fill in a distance gap?

Usually golfers get 8 - 12 yards between irons (10 yard average) and 13 to 17 yards between fairway metals (15 yards average). Filling in the estimated yardage column first often proves that many of us have a tough time simply guessing how far we hit the ball. Try it out next time you are at the range!
